

According to the report, the number of Oregonians receiving aid in dying through Oregon’s landmark Death with Dignity Act has remained stable over the past 11 years. With predictable small increases as aid in dying becomes a normal part of end-of-life care options.

“The Oregon law continues to have a significant, positive impact on end-of-life care while being infrequently used,” said George Eighmey, executive director of Compassion & Choices of Oregon. “In 2008, our organization continued its role as the steward of Oregon’s unique aid-in-dying law.”

The report also reveals the act poses no harm to vulnerable populations.
