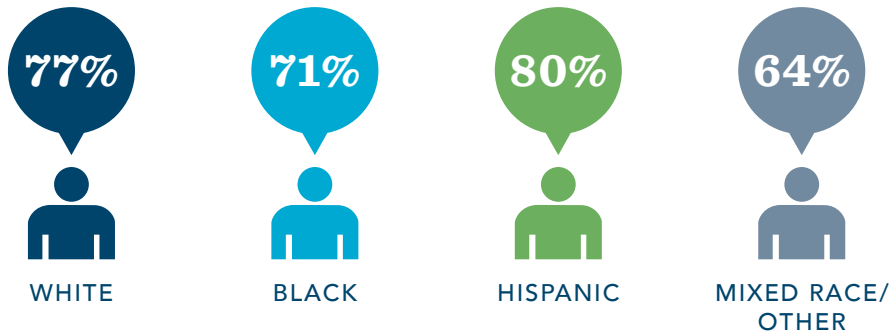


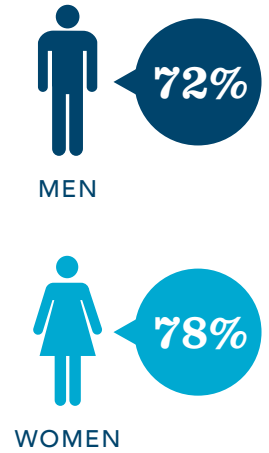
75% of Connecticut Voters Support Medical Aid-in-Dying Legislation

Legislation to allow medical aid in dying, an option for mentally capable, terminally ill adults to peacefully end unbearable suffering, is supported by a wide majority of Connecticut voters regardless of race, ethnicity, religion, age, gender identity, political affiliation or whether they have a disability.

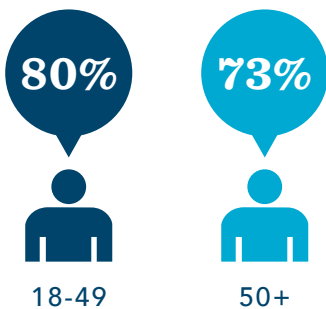

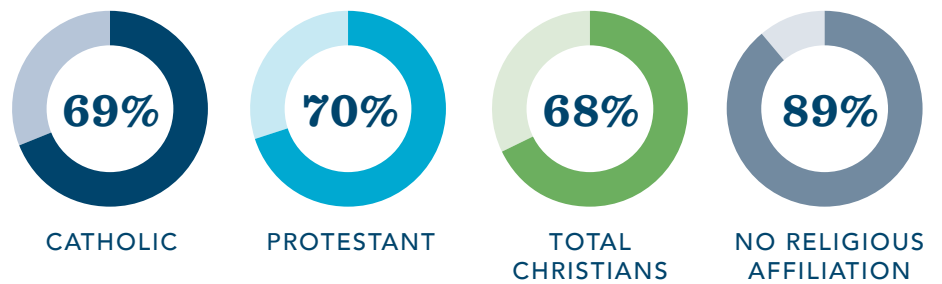
GENDER IDENTITY



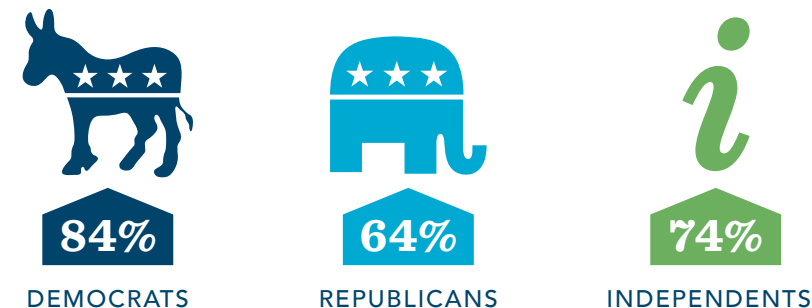
