

SPECIAL SPRING ACTION:

Help Authorize Medical Aid in Dying in New York!

Lawmakers in New York introduced the Medical Aid in Dying Act in January 2017. Modeled after laws in California and Oregon, it would allow a terminally ill, mentally capable adult with a prognosis of six months or less to access medical aid in dying. Legislators have a two year legislative session to make this bill law in New York.

With your help, we could make New York the next jurisdiction to authorize aid in dying, allowing 1 in 5 Americans access to this vital end-of-life option. Recently, vocal opponents lined the halls of the New York State Capitol to demonstrate their opposition the legislation. It's time for lawmakers to hear the voices of the 77 percent of New Yorkers who support the option to choose medical aid in dying.

Compassion & Choices NY will host a Lobby Day on May 9 where our supporters will converge on the Capitol, visible in their yellow shirts, to tell lawmakers to pass the Medical Aid in Dying Act. And as the third most populous state in the union, progress in New York pushes our whole movement forward.




