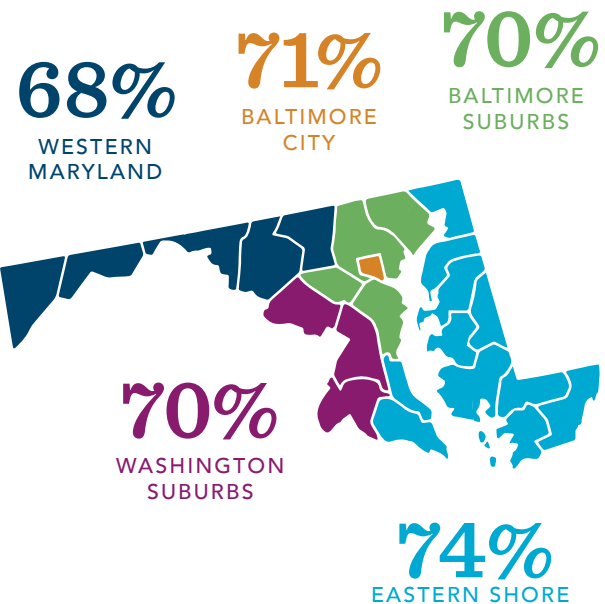


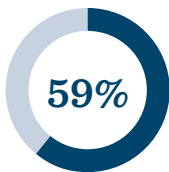
# Maryland Voters Support Medical Aid in Dying

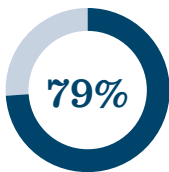
## Support for Medical Aid in Dying Is Consistent Across Maryland

**of voters** personally want the option of medical aid in dying.

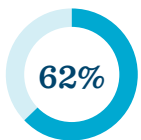

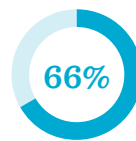

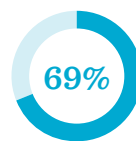

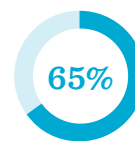
